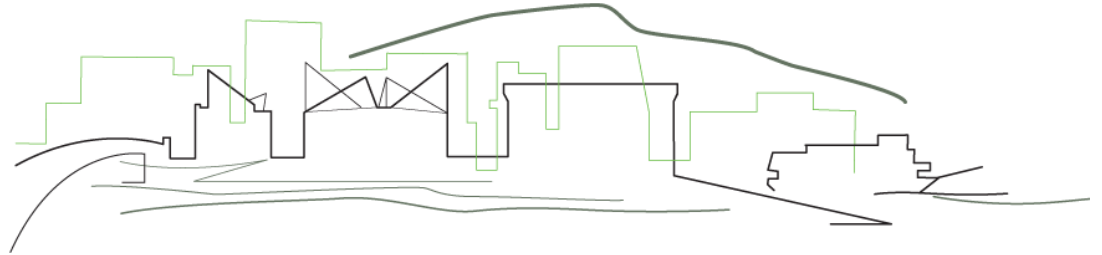

Goals:

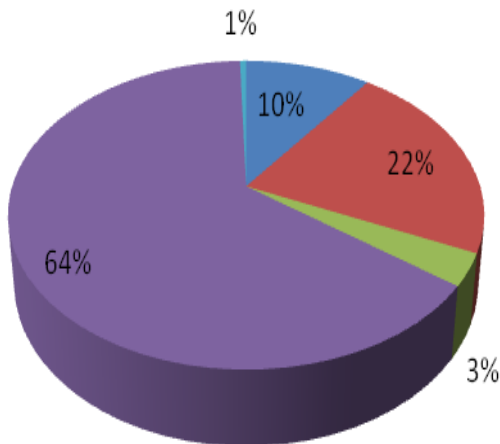
- To facilitate investment in technology-based companies in the Chattanooga area by providing a forum which links investors with local entrepreneurs

- Supported and facilitated the Tennessee Department of Economic Development technology mission

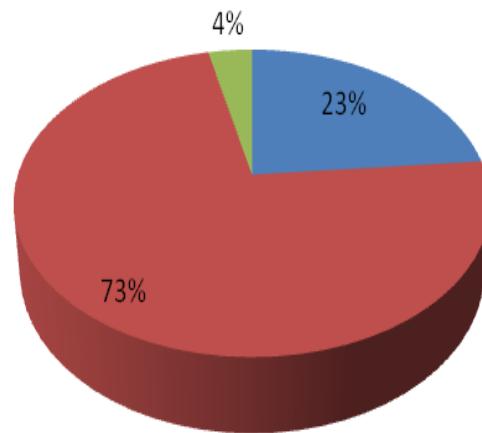
